In 2024, the METASTARS Innovative Projects have been successfully completed by the SMEs. In the second half of the year, the Call for Prizes was launched and concluded with the awarding of prizes at the METASTARS final event.

On December 4, a Steering Committee meeting took place in Toulouse, France, where we reviewed the project's progress and discussed the final steps. On the same day, we also met with the AD-ASTRA project consortium to identify synergies between our projects and explore future collaboration opportunities.
